## **English**

## **Reading**

- In school, we do whole class reading. We are currently reading Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. This allows the class to explore texts together that are more advanced at their reading level or above. In turn, the children are exposed to richer vocabulary and the children have an opportunity to explore different fiction, non-fiction and poetry books.
- □ We refer to VIPERS skills across the curriculum.
- We have 'story time' at the end of the day for 15 mins to promote our love of reading.
- The children take it in turns to update a 'reading journal' to promote a book they've loved!
- The Oxford reading levels do not always match up to the school scheme so please don't worry!





## **Mathematics**

- Mathematics is taught every day.
- We place emphasis on being fluent in the topic being taught and then move onto reasoning and problem solving – applying that knowledge.
- As a school, we a following a Mastery Mathematics approach to teaching: concrete, pictorial and abstract.
- Cubes, counters, beads, tens & ones, number lines, part whole models, base tens and place value mats are all used to aid children's understanding.



## **Mathematics**

In year 4 we like to begin the lesson by briefly re-capping previous learning or setting some questions based on core arithmetic. We call it Flashback 4 Let's have a go!

#### Weekly Times Table focus

Children will complete times table activities on a Wednesday morning to improve fluency.

They will also be set TTR battles and other games within the programme.

In Year 4 all the children will participate in a statutory multiplication test. This is at the end of the year and we will follow up with more information closer to the time.
