End of School Day Arrangements and Collection Times

Please note that pick up times are as follows:

3:15pm Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to 6) 3:20pm Key Stage 1 (Foundation, Year 1 & Year 2).

The staggered times are there to help reduce the number of children coming out of the school at once and that they can leave the site school safely.

Universal Free School Meals - All children in FY, Yr1 and Yr2 are entitled to a FREE SCHOOL MEAL every day- please ensure that you take up your entitlement.

KS2 (Y3-6) can continue with school dinners, and are encouraged to, as these are varied, nutritious and tasty, encouraging the children to try different foods. **Dinner Money** – Payable by '*Parent pay*' only, this term is £12.00 per week (£2.40 per day)
