


Reading

- > We will be having whole class reading comprehension lessons.
- > Explore texts together.
- Exposure to richer vocabulary
- > Exploration of different fiction, non-fiction and poetry books.
- > We refer to VIPERS skills across the curriculum.

Mathematics

- Mathematics is taught every day.
- We place emphasis on being fluent in the topic being taught and then move onto reasoning and problem solving – applying that knowledge.
- As a school, we a following a Mastery Mathematics approach to teaching: concrete, pictorial and abstract.



Mathematics

In year 4 we like to begin the lesson by briefly re-capping previous learning or setting some questions based on core arithmetic. We call it a Review.


Times Table focus

SODA- times tables activity (daily)

Times Tables lesson (weekly)

Children will complete times table activities on a Wednesday morning to improve fluency and will have time on TTRS to practise.

In Year 4 all the children will participate in a statutory multiplication test. This is at the end of the year and we will follow up with more information closer to the time.





Key dates and Assessment

- > At the end of each term, the children will complete assessments in reading, grammar and spellings and maths.
- ➤ In mathematics, the children will complete a 10 question pre and post assessment based on the block that they will be learning.

Multiplication tables check

Schools must administer the multiplication tables check within the 2-week period from Monday 1 June 2026.

- > They will be sent home every half term to be washed.



- Work together with the school staff to achieve positive outcomes for all children.





