

Spring Term 2026 Curriculum Plan for Parents – Year 3J and 3R

Religious Education



Christmas - Through the unit of Christmas, children will reflect on the birth of Jesus Christ and who he is. They will empathise with the feelings and reactions of the shepherds at this event and will know that the crib is an important symbol of prayer and devotion, first introduced by St. Francis.

Reconciliation- Children will prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children will know that human beings often have freedom to make choices and understand the difference between good and bad choices. They will explore the consequences of sin, Christ's teaching on forgiveness and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They will participate in class prayer which will include an examination of conscience and an Act of Contrition, Mass responses and Liturgy of the Word.

Lent- During the Season of Lent, children will understand that the Season of Lent is a time when Christians try to change to be more like Christ. They will be introduced to new Gospel stories about Christ bringing change to the lives of people who were sick and in need.

Holy Week- The unit is designed to help deepen the children's knowledge of some of the events of Holy Week and to deepen their understanding of the foundation of the Church's celebration of the Mass.

Homework 	<p>Homework - English homework and maths homework will be set on a Monday and will be due in on the following Monday.</p> <p>Reading books will be checked and changed on Mondays and Thursdays. Please remind your child to place their book in the box on those days so they can be changed. Please send the book in each day so that we can hear your child read their reading book each week.</p> <p>Spellings - Spellings homework will be sent home each week and revised during spelling lessons on Mondays.. These should be revised on paper at home using the 'look, cover, write, check' method. Children should understand the definition of the word and be able to use their spellings within a sentence.</p> <p>A selection of VIPERS (vocabulary, inference, predict, explain, retrieve and summarise) questions and tasks to enable the children to build comprehension and word reading skills are listed below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who is the main character? • Why is this mark used '!'? • What does the author want you to think? • What type of book is this? • Find the words that tell you.... • What does this phrase mean? • Why does the author use...? (a particular adjective)? • In what time is the book set? How do you know?
